New survey methodologies for pools, campgrounds, and food were discussed. Additionally, ODH provided updates on proposed rule updates for various programs. As the rule update process begins, OEHA will communicate and solicit feedback from our membership. If you are interest in a particular program, please contact us to be include in the specific program's committee. Committees are tasked with reviewing proposed rules and providing feedback on behalf of the association.

Additionally, a Request for Proposal (RFP) for an EH Data System will be released soon. ODH is working alongside The Ohio Department of Administrative Services to release a RFP for a system which will eventually replace Healthspace. ODH has requested that OEHA and AOHC provide a representative to the RFP review committee. As this process gets underway, OEHA will provide updates to the membership.

Lastly, as discussed at the August 16 meeting, the board is requesting input from our membership on any legislative topics and ideas. We are preparing for a busy lame duck session of the Ohio legislature. Now is our time to finalize and prepare for any last minute legislative priorities. We are also actively preparing for a new session of the Ohio legislature. The board has been and will continue to discuss our legislative priorities in preparation for the next biennial budget. We are striving to be more proactive in this process. It is imperative that you engage with us in this process. There is no topic that is unimportant or too small to be addressed legislatively. We urge you to send us ideas, problems, or suggestions that could be addressed in either the lame duck session or via the next biennial budget.

I hope you find time to enjoy the last few days of summer, and I am looking forward to seeing you all at the fall conferences.

## New Sanitarian Advisory Board Appointed

Most, if not all of you reading this are now aware of the fact that when the Governor's Budget Bill (HB 49) was signed into law on June 29, 2017, the Board of Sanitarian Registration was abolished and administrative functions related to the registration of sanitarians in Ohio was moved to the Ohio Department of Health (ODH). That change became effective on September 29, 2017. The former Board of Sanitarian Registration is now known as the Sanitarian Advisory Board.

While the Board's name and office location has changed, many things remain the same. The law has not changed with respect to the requirements to be a Registered Sanitarian or Sanitarian in Training. The following statutory requirements remain unchanged:

- Individuals are still required to renew their registration on an annual basis;
- The definition of the practice of environmental health has not changed;
- There is no change in the educational requirements to become registered;
- There is no change in the testing requirement;
- There is no change in the continuing education requirement; and
- The licensure portal (eLicense) will continue to be used for all application and renewal processes.

In addition, Stephanie Youst continues to serve as the Program Administrator for the Sanitarian Advisory Board.

Probably the biggest difference between the Board of Sanitarian Registration and the new Sanitarian Advisory Board is the function of each. The Board of Sanitarian Registration operated as one unit by reviewing requests and applications, discussing various aspects of each and formally voting on those items. It was a very democratic process. The RS Board met approximately every 8 weeks to conduct routine business and Board members often served several 3 year terms.

In contrast, it has been decided that the

Sanitarian Advisory Board will meet twice each year and acts in an advisory capacity to the Director of the Ohio Department of Health. All actions requiring approval receive preliminary evaluation by the Chief of the Bureau of Environmental Health & Radiation Protection and the Program Administrator with a recommendation provided to the Director of the Ohio Department of Health. This is done approximately every two weeks which has resulted in quicker approval of applications and requests for continuing education. Each Board member will be limited to two (2) consecutive three (3) year terms.

All information related to sanitarian registration is available on the Ohio Department of Health's website and can be accessed by using the alphabetical index. There you can find a link to the Ohio e-License portal, important forms and continuing education information.
