Columbus Public Health received the Joe Beck Educational Contribution Award. The award recognizes an individual or team for an educational contribution designed for the advancement and professional development of environmental health professionals through instruction or development of an educational or training tool. One session I attended was about the power of connections. Please remember that each of you are more than what you do as part of your profession. Much of our job is delivering messages to people that they do not want to hear; "those food items must be thrown away", "your septic system need replaced", "your well water is not safe to drink" and "you

have to clear everyone from the pool because you do not have any chlorine". The people we are protecting do not always appreciate how hard our job is and sometimes we hear the comments of the patrons of these businesses directed towards us. Sometimes we build a shell to protect ourselves from the comments and that shell may extend into our time outside of work. This is where our connections with friends, families and coworkers are needed. After a hard day of delivering the hard decisions of our profession, reach out to someone and talk through the hard decisions of the day. Do not sit at home alone and think about how pink the solution was on the free chlorine test or if you may have contaminated that water sample. Go out and interact through social or athletic activities. Find a group that supports you and spend some time with that group. Also, as a member of someone else's support network be aware of what others are going through. Check in with a coworker if they had to close a public swimming pool, condemn a home a family was living in, issue orders for the replacement of a septic system. That EHS probably had comments directed toward them that were not of appreciation nor were the comments kind. That EHS probably needs to hear that their job means something and that those hard decisions are a benefit to the community.

Lastly please remember that the fall conferences are coming up. Put in your PO requests at your office, renew your membership, start a new membership and encourage others to join OEHA. I will see you at each conference. Please seek me out if you have any ideas or recommendations for OEHA.



# OEHA AEC – What was with that conference app?

For the 2024 AEC, the Ohio **Environmental Health** Association's Board decided to try out an app for the conference. The Whova app was obtained with a twovear contract for the 2024 and 2025 AECs using grant funds through a Workforce Development Grant from the Ohio Department of Health. The app was



intended to help members and attendees navigate the conference a little better. With the app, members could see the agenda and even make their own personal agenda with just the sessions they wanted to attend. They could also message other attendees, post pictures, see speaker and exhibitor info, post questions to the speakers in the sessions and more.

For this past AEC, with a little over 300 total attendees we had a 67% percent download rate with about 210 active app users. Some of the most favored aspects of the app were the ability to see the agenda and the enhanced networking pieces such as messaging and sharing information. Members had a much easier way to see who was at the conference, contact them to just say hi or post questions to ask about the conference or even job-related issues which started several great discussions. There were other features such as photo and article sharing; viewing member, speaker and exhibitor information; private messaging

among members; and instant messaging to all members if there were any changes to the conference such as room or session changes. There were 623 total postings on the community message board on multiple topics. We also created some contests and ice breakers with the ability to score points for utilizing the different app features; many members utilized this function and even won some prizes.

The board and AEC Planning
Committee intend to utilize the app for the
2025 conference and then will determine if the
Whova app, or a different one, will be secured
for future conferences. Next year we expect to
build upon the app usage rate and get it up to
75-80% with some more advertisement and
instructions. Networking is one of the best
aspects of the conference and nothing beats inperson networking, but the app can hopefully
build upon that. We hope the app makes the
AEC even more useful to members and creates
a better experience.
